







How did we get here?

25% Teacher Support

The fund supports teachers to receive gift certificate vouchers to support remote instruction and their well-being.

18% Meal Service

The fund supports the increased costs of this service including the possible resumption of caregiver meals.

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, have you shifted at least some of your funding to focus on supporting any of the following?

43% General Support

The fund supports the immediate needs of your school system and its community of students, teachers and their families.

40% Support for remote learning

The fund is supporting costs for system-wide online learning platforms.

2% Telehealth Medical Appointment Fees

The fund is providing fee vouchers for telehealth visits for families who are uninsured and do not qualify for free/reduced meal benefits or Medicaid.

1% Translation and Interpretation Services

The fund increases the system's capacity for on-demand and rapid response translation and interpretation services for our families who speak different languages other than English.
