

"I'm excited to have students track their progress, collaborate in teams to solve mathematics and ELAR concepts."



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

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## Newly formed education foundation for LHHS makes fundraising goals for first year

The Lake Highlands High School Education Foundation is starting its first year with plans to raise \$250,000 for teachers and students.

The organization was formed in March as a non-profit to oversee annual fundraising campaign <u>Wild for Cats</u> and the <u>LHHS Alumni Association</u>. Wild for Cats previously operated under the Richardson ISD Foundation.

"We wanted to bring [Wild for Cats] in house to be more readily available to meet the needs of students and staff at the high school and to be more responsive to our donors," said Robin Moss Norcross, president of the LHHSEF.

LHHSEF is currently running a <u>founding partner campaign</u> toward starting overhead costs and to start assisting high school students and teachers in need. This campaign will run until the end of the year.




