What is Austin ISD?






EST. 1881

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


Points of Pride

- **Champions** for Austin ISD
- Over \$46M in support for Austin ISD strategic priorities and initiatives since 2001
- Inspire the Future Event, featuring the Superintendent's State of the District Address since 2015
- \$1.7M awarded to 365 teacher-created projects on AISD campuses since 2015
- Raised \$10.2M for AISD Crisis Support Fund providing basic needs assistance and educational supports during the pandemic.










Origination of Grant Program







Our Grants History: Pre-Pandemic




2015-2019

Encourages new & creative instructional approaches and learning experiences

All schools, no criteria regarding student demographics

Awarded \$441,000 to 98 projects







Our Grants History: Pre-Pandemic



Project Focus Area

2016-2020

Provides time-sensitive educationally enriching opportunities that level the field

Schools with >60% students identified as economically disadvantaged

Awarded \$281,000 to 76 projects

Our Grants History: Pandemic




2020-2021

Supports time-sensitive needs for educational enhancement & innovation in response to the pandemic, racial injustice, and winter storms

All schools, but priority given to students who are identified as economically disadvantaged

Awarded \$692,000 to 136 projects





Project Focus Area



It's Time for a Focus on Equity



- How can we reduce barriers for teachers applying for the grant program?
- Teachers being impacted were not reflective of the students being impacted.
- Partnered with research consultant to **conduct equity analysis** of grants program.
- Recommendations
 - Encourage student voice in development of the grant and review process.
 - o Collect better data around success and applicant demographics.
 - **Revise rubric** to be more precise and incorporate additional **priority points** to focus our impact on marginalized students and staff.
 - Recruit more diverse and well-represented community review team.
 - Increase awareness campaign across all schools, with a focus on strategic outreach to ones that never been awarded or have new principals.
- After analysis, we had to balance recommendations with existing procedures.



Our Grants History: Post(ish)-Pandemic




2022-2023

Supports innovative approaches that address inequities found in our community, as well as student and staff wellbeing

All schools, but priority given to projects that impact marginalized student groups

Awarded \$300,000 to 52 projects & will award \$400,000 in 2023








Grant Program Award History











What Have We Learned?



- Schools know their needs, so we should trust and listen to the experts.
- Needs change, and so must our programs.
- Evaluation can be difficult. It's important to consistently collect data over time that is reasonable for a teacher.
- Funders and community supporters trust schools to utilize funding to positively impact students.





What's Are We Working On?

AUSTIN

- Ensure equitable opportunities for marginalized students.
- Build awareness of Austin Ed Fund as a resource for teachers, staff, and families.
- Serve as a vehicle for families and community supporters to give back to the district.
- Provide grant writing and crowdfunding campus support resources and trainings.
- Expand external support to schools through grants database and crowdfunding platforms.
- Scale innovative ideas from individual campuses to district-wide initiatives.
- Incorporate student voice in the process.
- Collect better data that is reasonable.
